# Message from the Swaledale Museum Reeth

With museums closing, or limiting their services, all around us, we are excited to offer more positive news. We are planning re-opening the Swaledale Museum from Monday 31st May, Mondays to Thursdays inclusive 10.00 am to 4.00 pm and at other times by appointment, just contact us. We can't wait to get back into our stride and see you all. We are still not sure about rescheduling our talks yet, but will keep you up-to-date with what is possible. We have a range of new acquisitions to display, including some books by Ruby Ferguson, but more on them in a later message.

Thank you all for your comments relating to the new releases on our Museum Image Archive. We are particularly grateful to the grand daughter of Emma Nathan (née Hodgson of Marrick). She recognised her grandmother in some of Eleanor Barker's photographs, and has told us she lived at Lock Heather in Healaugh, and tended the phone box there. You may remember it - carpeted and always with a vase of fresh flowers in it. We are hoping to gain further information to help bring these pictures alive for future generations

Thanks to all of you who responded to our March photograph, and correctly pointed out that it was taken outside Reeth Workhouse, and shows the Board of Guardians. As I am writing this on International Women's' Day I thought I'd focus on the lady with the fine hat seated at the front. Thanks to re-

search by Alan Gibson and Tracy Little we featured this quietly famous lady in the Spring 2018 edition of the Friends of Swaledale Museum Newsletter. To paraphrase Tracy's longer article. in early 1907 Mrs. Elizabeth Eleanor Greathead was the first woman ever to be appointed to the office of a Clerk to a Board of Guardians. As the widow of Mr. Greathead, a solicitor, who held the office to the Reeth Board for a number of years, she was well acquainted with the duties to be performed. This was no mere secretarial post. We have some idea of what the job entailed, thanks to The Business Encyclopedia And Legal Adviser (1911), which stated that 'The position of Clerk to the Guardians carries with it great responsibility, and is the most important office in connection with the administration of the Poor Law in the Union.

He is the expert adviser to the Guardians on all matters affecting indoor and outdoor relief and those relating to the powers and duties of the Guardians. The Clerk is not obliged to belong to the legal profession, though this probably obtains in the majority of instances. and in such cases the fact is of considerable advantage to the Board...'. Born Elizabeth Eleanor Bennett, a farmer's daughter from Deddington, Oxfordshire, she came to Swaledale when she married, aged 17, local solicitor Francis Joseph Greathead in 1879. Greathead was very much a part of an increasing involvement of women in politics but was way ahead of the field in holding the position she did. Astonishingly, two decades later, she was still unique.

The Leeds Mercury reported in 1926: We would love to know more about this 'The only woman who is a clerk to Guardians and also to a Council, Mrs. E. E. Greathead, of Reeth, is retiring.' The other lady in the photograph is the Matron Mrs White, and sitting between them is Joseph Peacock of Punchard.

We do not know who the handsomely bewhiskered man to the far right in this row is. Do any of you know?

I wonder if we ran a Greatest Lady from the Dales competition - who would you chose and why?



This month instead of a photograph from our collection we present an object. One of the most enigmatic of items that we care for is a strip of unfinished patchwork, with the backing papers still in. You can see here the finger tip of one of our volunteers Clara Baltesz . Several years ago she catalogued some of our textile collection. She has a very groovy style in nail polish. She reveals one of the backing papers. Others are made from envelopes postmarked 1891, advertising for animal medicines. Methodist circuit plans and playing cards. I wonder does anyone recognise this wonderful patchwork, as we have no provenance for it.

# Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority Strongly Condemn Recent Shootings of Birds of Prey Bainbridge 12th March 2021

The Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority are shocked, but sadly not surprised, by footage recently released by the RSPB investigations team of two buzzards being lured to their deaths on a North Yorkshire grouse moor.

Neil Heseltine, Chair of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority said:

"This shows a callous disregard for the law and birds of prey that is all too familiar from some within the community. The Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority condemns raptor persecution in the strongest possible terms and continues to work closely with partners and others to stamp out this crime once and for all.

"This incident, and the continuing issue of bird of prey persecution in the County demands maximum exposure. People need to know what is happening here and the devastating impact this is having on our protected species.

"ALL birds of prey are protected by law and killing them is a criminal offence. If this activity continues it is difficult to see how the Government in England will not be forced to examine other ways in which to prevent this criminality. Certainly the actions of the individual involved in this case can only be assisting those who wish to see the end of driven grouse shooting. For that reason, if no other, you would hope someone in the community might expose their obnoxious criminal activity.

"Finally, I would encourage anyone, local or visitor, who witnesses any suspicious activity while they're out and about in the countryside, or anyone who is made aware of it through their networks, to contact the Police".

For concerns about a possible wildlife crime, you should call 101. If you witness a suspected wildlife crime in action, call 999 immediately and ask for the Police. Finally, you can speak in confidence about raptor persecution directly with the RSPB on 0300 9990101

# **Border Collie Rescue**

### Dog Food Support Program

We are running a program to assist people who are in financial difficulties because of the pandemic to feed their dogs. In some cases people are going without themselves to ensure their dogs are fed and in other cases it is the dog that loses out.

The extreme side of this is that some people are being forced to part with their dogs due to their temporary circumstances.

We want people to be able to keep their dogs and themselves well fed throughout this crisis and if they are in financial hardship the provision of food for their dogs will free up some cash to enable them to look after themselves better. Everybody wins.

We will supply free complete dried dog food to eligible people in the Two Dales. In most cases we would provide enough dog food to feed their dog/s for one month. This could be repeated. There is no restriction on breed of dog. For the duration of the program it is not restricted to Border Collies!

We will deliver to their houses directly in most villages and set up times and locations where people can meet us to collect food if they are outside of our delivery areas.

Delivery areas will be in the principal villages up to Muker in Swaledale and Langthwaite in Arkengarthdale.
To be eligible people must be able to demonstrate hardship.

The simplest way would be to provide evidence of receipt of some sort of state benefit or basic state pension but there may be some people who are on furlough or have been self employed and are receiving no help, or insufficient help, to get by.

We would have to look at such cases on an individual basis

To enrol on the program, eligible people would simply need to contact us.

There is one other caveat - people must not be receiving support from the Richmond food bank as we are already supplying dog food to them for them to distribute to people who have provided proof of eligibility to their satisfaction.

Swale Vets are aware of the program and in cases where they feel that one of their clients would benefit they will put them directly in touch with us but outside of themselves and the food bank we need to make more people aware of the opportunity for support if they need it.

We are also looking for somewhere in Reeth where we can leave bagged up dog food - sufficient for an average dog for one week - where people can pick up a bag if they need it.

It must be somewhere open to the public at least a couple of days a week - Friday being one - and under some sort of general supervision. We would rely on people's honesty in taking dog food in this way and this is one reason why we (continued on next page)

we would want it to be under some sort of supervision.

People are less likely to abuse the program if they could be seen collecting food.

If the smaller bags are insufficient they could come onto the main program Running with Dogs / Running FOR Dogsfor be provided. We would supply a plastic dustbin or other similar container and fill it with bags of food. When it's contents get low someone could call us and we would top it up.

Our funds are not bottomless but we would carry this on for as long as we could

Initially we are proposing 3 months. It could be longer - it depends on take up.

More affluent people could make a donation to the program to extend its duration and we will be appealing for additional funding from other sources.

Please note - we are a voluntary organisation. A registered charity in England and Wales and also registered in Scotland. No one will benefit from this other than the recipients of the food. This program is being run to help local people, primarily in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale.



Emma said: "I have an art account on Instagram **@ehodgson\_art** where I post some drawings every now and then. I posted my study of a Jesse



## Spring 'Springs' Into Action

Now that we have gone through this pretty harsh winter, many of the things we love about spring are here with lambs, snow drops and daffodils popping up around Swaledale. However, one thing is missing, three certain species of birds, that migrate from miles away for our cooler climate.

From mid-April to May we can expect to start to see and hear Swifts, Swallows and House Martins. Happily nesting above the eaves of the pubs, churches, rundown buildings or in the crevasses of your very own house!

These birds are amazing, migrating from as far away as South Africa (6000 miles) to the UK! Each of these birds have their own unique features and interesting facts.

The Swift is a light black to dark brown bird with a white beard on their throat. It has a short but wide beak. making catching insects an easy task for these magnificent creatures. It has the largest wingspan out of all three birds, measuring at 38-40cm (15-16 inches). These are also geometrical being closely compared to a scythe. This bird has a fork like tail just like the other two birds. Swifts are so adapted to catching insects, that they barely ever touch the ground to perch or even walk. They sleep on the wing throughout their life, swooping in parties of other Swifts and chasing one another in a spectacular air performance. Their fledglings, unlike other birds, practice flapping their wings before flight. They even do push ups to prepare themselves! Not only do they have a unique exercise routine, they are

also exceptionally reliable couples. It is well documented that Swifts mate for life (Pair-Bonding) meeting in Spring in Europe (late April - mid May) and then both travelling back to Africa around mid to late summer (mid July - early August).

Now Swallows. These small creatures have a red throat with a blue back and white front. They have a pointer fork shaped tail compared to the swift's bigger fork, looking similar to a meat fork. Their agile tail feathers give them the manoeuvrability to catch insects on the wing, which is on another skill level to Swifts and House Martins. Unlike Swifts, Swallows make their nest out of dry dirt and spit to make it more difficult for predators to see. The nests can last up to 15 years and not only made of spit and mud but also made of bits collected by the female swallows (predominately). They love to nest in old barns and under eaves, giving them their appropriate full name the Barn Swallow, Swallows arrive by late March to mid May, leaving again for Southern Africa from September to October. This journey takes an exceedingly long time, with Swallows traveling 200 miles a day to reach their winter home.

House martins, are the third of these migratory birds. Known for their dark blue capped heads which fade into a dull black on its wings and a white on its underbelly. Like Swallows, house martins make their nests out of mud and spit, but unlike Swallows, they much prefer to nest on buildings. These birds are colonial, with some birds brooding on their own while others breeding in large colonies of more than 30 nests. (continued next page)

On my way to the Antarctic, I stopped off at South Georgia for about 6 weeks before heading further south. The base at South Georgia is just on the other side of the bay from the abandoned whaling station at Grytviken where Shackleton is buried. It was also where the Falklands 'unpleasantness' first kicked off, with the arrival of Argentinian 'scrap merchants' there.


Out of interest, I've attached a few photos that I took when I was there. The first is Shackleton's grave in the whalers graveyard at Grytviken,
